

## Kirkman's Cove Lake Watershed Management Plan

The Kirkman's Cove Watershed Management Plan is a cooperative effort between the [Nebraska Environmental Trust](#), Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, the Natural Resources Conservation Service, Nebraska Game and Parks, and the Nemaha Natural Resources District. The purpose of the management plan is to reduce the amount of sediment entering into Kirkman's Cove Lake with the implementation of Best Management Practices throughout the watershed. Cost-share is available of up to 90% on some practices such as flood control structures, grade stabilization structures, and tile terraces. The amount of funding for this project should approach nearly one million dollars over the span of the management plan. Funds for the project were contributed in the amount of \$200,000 from the Nebraska Environmental Trust, \$400,000 from the EPA's 319 funding secured by the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, \$200,000 from the Natural Resources Conservation Service EQIP funding, \$100,000 from the Nemaha Natural Resources District, and more funding was provided from the landowners for the implementation of the practices.
