A. Natural Resources Conservation Service

Agreement with NRCS for Sediment Basin above Duck Creek: Nelson explained the details to be included in the agreement, which covers 100 percent of the cost of a sediment basin above the Duck Creek reservoir, including \$300,000 for construction and \$50,000 to hire a consultant. NRD costs include any land rights and mitigation. Hilske added that though we don't have the final agreement yet, NRCS would like to have the NRD sign and return it as soon as possible once it is provided.

Gerweck moved, seconded by Bohling, to approve the agreement with NRCS for funding and technical assistance for construction of a sediment basin above the Duck Creek reservoir and authorize the Manager to sign the agreement. Motion carried.

3. *Discussion on Groundwater Management Region Boundaries:* Wingert reviewed a map that was included in the report received last month from LBG. They are looking at using it to start delineating boundaries. No action.

B. Operations & Education Committee

1. Revisions to District Recreation Area Rules & Regulations: No one from the public attended the public hearing on the changes, with was held prior to the board meeting. The major revisions included adding Duck Creek Recreation Area to the rules, limiting camping at Prairie Owl to seven days, and removing references to specific fee amounts from the rules. Therefore, any future changes to fees would be handled by board action and would not require a revision to the rules and regulations. (A full scope of the changes is attached to the file copy of these minutes.)

Romine moved, seconded by Sugden, to approve the revisions to the Nemaha NRD Recreation Area Rules & Regulations as presented with an effective date of January 1, 2018. Motion carried.

2. New District-wide Park Entry & Use Fees: Romine reviewed the proposed changes:

- 2. Eliminate discount period of \$2 for early purchase (Jan-Mar)
- 3. Second permit price: increase from \$6 to \$8

Temporary Park Permits

- 1. Increase from \$5 per 2-day permit to \$5 per day
- 2. Change description to "Daily Park Permits"

Romine moved, seconded by Siske, to approve the fee schedule changes for NNRD park entry permits as presented effective January 1, 2018. After some discussion on the increased fees and increased revenue, motion carried.

After some discussion about liability and life expectancy of the equipment, motion carried.
