A. Natural Resources Conservation Service

Reichmuth reported they are trying to get EQIP applications ready and are getting caught up on wetland determinations.

B. Five Rivers RC&D

Sugden reported there was no meeting last month due to lack of attendance.

C. Nebraska Association of Resources Districts

Gigstad reported that there was a good-sized crowd at the Legislative Conference. He talked about the bills that were reviewed. He also talked about the NACD annual conference adding that he had the opportunity to meet the new NRCS Chief.

A. Programs & Projects Committee

- 1. Well Permit Applications: None received.
- 2. Potential Options for Using Telemetry on Monitoring Wells & Flowmeters: Hilske explained that he attended a session during the Legislative Conference about some new technology that would make it more cost effective. Gerweck commented that the board needs to keep moving forward on this. No action.
- 3. **Presentation on Irrigation Efficiency Technology:** Keith Grimm had addressed the committee and went over some options and technology with them. He expressed his appreciation for what the board is doing. No action.

B. Operations & Education Committee

- 1. Urban Special Project Intent to Apply Submissions: Hodges reviewed the submissions from both Nebraska City and from Falls City. He explained that the committee reviewed them, and they met the general guidelines for the program. Staff will now work with each to develop a final, detailed application package for the board to review in May. No action.

- 3. Quotes for Construction of Maintenance Building at Duck Creek Recreation Area: Quotes received were as follows for a 30x60x12 ft post frame building with metal exterior, two overhead doors, and one additional overhead or slider door:

Hilske added that quotes were being obtained for the electricity with one received so far for around \$4,000. Stukenholtz expressed concern that putting the building at Duck Creek would subject it to vandalism and that the board should have been consulted on the location. Niedfeldt felt that the location had been discussed though not the specific site at the park. After further discussion, motion carried.

He added that he had testified on LB150 which would change provisions relating to public records requests and allow a charge to non-residents for time and expenses required to assemble the records.
