#### January Managers Report

January 5, 2022

#### **Current NRD News:**

Rod Horn retired from the South Platte NRD. Rod originally played football for Nebraska in the late 70's and was drafted into the NFL and played for the Bengals. Rod is retiring after over 40 years with the South Platte NRD.

Marlin Petermann passed away on December 22 due to complications from pneumonia. He was employed with the Papio-Missouri River NRD for 48 years. Marlin was the Assistant Manager.

Dave Clabaugh, the manager of the Lower Big Blue NRD, retired January 6<sup>th</sup>. He has worked for the NRD system for almost 30 years.

Dr. Robert Ottemann came to our office to collect any information that he may need to do the salary survey for the district. He is hoping to compare 10-12 other entities to the packages that the Nemaha NRD provides, compared to what others provide along with salaries, so he can present his findings and recommendations to the board within the next few months.

We awarded and started to work with FYRA on the 319 works for Kirkman's Cove. They have just started to work on information collection, so hopefully in the next few months they will have some updates and more to report on.

Ashley Rippe started on December 16<sup>th</sup>, so we are coming up on a month employed. She will be attending the meeting so she will have a chance to introduce herself and answer any questions that anyone may have for her.

The NRCS secretary position in Falls City is still open. We are hoping to relist the position after the first of the year to see if we can get any interested candidates for the position. If we don't receive any good applications, we may have to wait until the salary survey is completed and we start the new fiscal year for any salary adjustments that may be considered.

A town hall meeting was held in Peru by the Northeast Nemaha County Long-Term Recovery Group (LTRG). This group has been working to get Nemaha Co. and more specifically the Peru area for economic recovery from the flooding that caused a lot of issues for the area. The trail was brought up in the meeting. It seems that there is support locally for the trail and the area around the depot. I will continue to work with the group and Peru to find out what they envision the trail and depot area to be used for in the future.

The NARD conference is still scheduled for the 25-26<sup>th</sup> of January. Anyone that reached out to attend the conference and needed a hotel room should be registered and days reserved that were requested.

The start of the 60-day (short session) legislative session started January 5<sup>th</sup>. There will be 10 business days to start the session that any bills can be introduced. As of the 5<sup>th</sup> there were no updates to any bills that would be introduced in this session. I would guess that there will be a few that will come out of the LR23 testimonies, but time will tell if they are proposed and if they make the floor.

## NRCS MONTHLY REPORT January 2022

### **Updates**

NRCS staff update: Megan Timms has been hired as an NRCS Soil Conservationist in the Tecumseh Office. Megan worked for the NRCS in Tecumseh this past summer as a Pathways Intern and is now a full time NRCS employee. Megan is from Adams, Nebraska and graduated from the University of Nebraska – Lincoln with a BS in Wildlife Ecology. While in college, Megan worked for the Lower Big Blue NRD as well as the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy. Megan enjoys spending her free time outdoors hunting and fishing, kinking in the mountains, helping on her family feedlot, and spending time with friends and family.

**COVID UPDATE:** NRCS staffing restrictions have increased and fluctuate weekly based on the continued rapid rise of COVID cases. NRCS offices are still open but walk-in customers must wear a mask and appointments are encouraged as we can only have one customer in the office at a time.

### **NSWCP**

NRCS is scheduled to meet with Kyle and Jane to discuss SWCP incentives / cost share rates for FY22 projects.

### **Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP)**

Ranking pools have been developed and inventive funds have been determined for the FY22 EQIP program. The Nemaha NRD local fund pool received an approx. \$3000 increase from last year's funding level. FY22 initial allocation is \$344k for EQIP general "local" funds for the Nemaha NRD.

January 17 - the NRCS will start ranking EQIP applications that are eligible for this local funding pool.

### **Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)**

A tentative ranking deadline has been set for CSP applications in early May.

### **CRP**

The Continuous CRP program is still ongoing. Landowners interested in CRP should contact NRCS to get these areas of interest evaluated and start the planning and application process.

#### Other

The NRCS will be starting the process to schedule and hold a local working group meeting to obtain guidance from stakeholders within the Nemaha NRD to determine next year's USDA program priorities. This meeting was limited by COVID restrictions last winter and unfortunately may be limited this year also, but to obtain more input from local producers NRCS will be developing a questionnaire this year that can be completed and submitted to increase input from local stakeholders.

### Water Resources Board Meeting Report for January 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022 By Chuck Wingert, Water Resources Manager

### 1. Well Permits Received this Month (see maps on following page)

N751 - Richard & Maryann Jansen - received December 28th, 2021

- a. The well will be used to pivot irrigate approximately 140 acres of land on the southwest quarter of Section 27 Township 06 North Range 11 East of Johnson County. The well is to be located approximately 5 miles north of the City of Tecumseh.
- b. A flowrate of 500 gpm is desired from this well.
- c. The thickness of the principal aquifer is 29 feet consisting of fine, medium & coarse sand and fine to medium gravel. This formation sits on top of gray shale bedrock at 138 feet below ground surface. A transmissivity value of 18,117 gpd/ft was calculated from the geologic log.
- d. The location and geologic log of the testhole had total ranking score of **226 points**. There are no registered irrigation or public water supply wells and only one domestic well within 6,000 feet of the testhole location.

### N752 & N753 - Brooke Gerdes - received January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022

- a. The wells will be used to pivot irrigate approximately 125 acres of land on the northwest quarter of Section 31 Township 03 North Range 15 East of Richardson County. The wells are to be constructed in the center and the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 31 which is approximately 3 miles south of the Village of Stella.
- b. A flow rate of 500 gpm is desired.
- c. For N752: the thickness of the principal aquifer is 83 feet consisting of fine, medium & coarse sand and coarse gravel. This formation sits on top of shale bedrock at 178 feet below ground surface. A transmissivity value of 83,357 gpd/ft was calculated from the geologic log.
- d. For N753: the thickness of the principal aquifer is 97 feet consisting of very fine, fine, medium & coarse sand and very coarse gravel. The formation sits on top of the shale bedrock at 172 feet.
- e. The locations and geologic logs of the testholes had total ranking scores of **302 and 297 points,** respectively. There is one registered irrigation, zero public water supply wells and two registered domestic wells within 6,000 feet of the testhole location.


### **Additional Information**


