10. AUBURN INDUCED RECHARGE PERMIT APPLICATION COMMENT NOTICE

Hilske reviewed how this process would work in the event Auburn calls for water during low flow periods in the Little Nemaha River. DNR could require some or all junior surface water users to shut down, and it may also impact 145 storage permits on NRD operated structures that would become junior to Auburn's permit. It is unknown if the NRD would be required to release stored water from these structures, but he explained how difficult it would be to open the valves on most of these old watershed structures, if not impossible. Therefore, Hilske drafted a letter to the Director of DNR indicating the District's opposition to mandatory release of stored waters from our reservoirs to increase flows in the river. Discussion

centered on the inability to release the water, the efficiency of releasing water to satisfy Auburn's need for recharging their wellfield, and the fact that the stored water in these reservoirs would have been already released downstream into the Missouri River had the structures not been in place. After further discussion, Sugden moved, seconded by Gerweck, to direct the Manager to send the letter to the Department of Natural Resources to record the District's opposition to mandatory release of water from District reservoirs as a result of the City of Auburn's surface water permit. After further discussion, motion carried.
