- 2. *Update on LBG Groundwater Data Collection Project:* Wingert reviewed some maps and information provided by LBG. Hilske also commented on the maps and how this information relates to potential rule changes.
- 3. Selecting a Design Option for the Kirkman's Cove Sediment Basin: Nelson reviewed the two alternatives and explained the differences. Alternative 1 was a standard sediment basin project; alternative 2 included more opportunities for water

hazards on the golf course. However, the cost would be an additional \$65,000 for alternative 2, and the golf course did not have the funding to pay for it.

Gerweck moved, seconded by Gigstad to approve Alternative 1 sediment basin design for Kirkman's Cove. Nelson explained potential costs, grants available, and timetable to apply for them. After further discussion, motion carried.

# C. Executive Committee

Easement for Upper Big Nemaha 25-C Rehab Project:
 Niedfeldt moved, seconded by Lassen, to approve the easement with Rural Adams Company, LLC, for the rehabilitation to Upper Big Nemaha 25-C.

 Niedfeldt reviewed the general terms of the easement. Motion carried.

2. **Property & Liability Insurance Quote for FY 2018:** Niedfeldt reviewed the coverage provided and premium presented by The Harry A. Koch company for renewal of the District's insurance package. The premium came in lower than last year due to a new underwriter.

Niedfeldt moved, seconded by Gigstad, to approve the insurance quote totaling \$42,637 from The Harry A. Koch Co. for FY18 property & liability insurance. Motion carried.

3. Office Heating/AC System Replacement Quotes: Niedfeldt reviewed four quotes received but added the committee had questions about some things in the quotes. The committee wanted to make sure the low quote had adequate quality of equipment compared to the other quotes. Loseke asked whether staff had considered a geothermal system as he felt it was an NRD responsibility to get the most efficient system available. Hilske explained that the system had just begun to malfunction and that he was afraid it might require replacement before the end of the fiscal year. Therefore, we obtained quotes in the event it would not make it until July 1.

Niedfeldt moved, seconded by Sugden, to authorize the Manager to work with the bidders to find a suitable system within an allowance of \$8,000. After further discussion, motion carried.

- 4. USGS Stream Gaging Station on Muddy Creek: Niedfeldt explained the proposal and the partnership among several agencies. Initial cost of \$13,500 for installation would require an NRD contribution of \$4,500 with future, annual maintenance contributions of \$5,000. There were a lot of questions about the value of this information to the NRD and the cost of the annual maintenance. Gerweck and Speece didn't feel this was the NRD's responsibility for this location. No action was taken on the request.
- 5. FY2018 Salary Schedule: Niedfeldt presented the committee's recommendation of 1.5 percent cost-of-living plus \$5,400 for merit/service increases for based staff and 2.5 percent increase for the three, non-based staff (managers) for a total overall budget increase of 3 percent. McDonald asked how the insurance affects the salaries and budget. Hilske explained that health premiums will increase 5 percent, and single coverage is provided 100% and additional coverage 70% by the District. Hilske explained how the service increases work. Gerweck asked if there was anything included for long-time employees. He felt all the increases should be the same percentage.

After further discussion, Niedfeldt moved, seconded by Sugden, to approve a 1.5 percent cost-of-living increase for based staff and a 2.5 percent increase for the three non-based staff and the additional \$5,400 for merit/service increases. Motion carried.

Mahoney reviewed a summary of the major categories of revenue and expense, expected cash carryover, and the current property tax request. She pointed out a larger than normal revenue balance and how that might affect the tax levy. Hilske added that we would know more in a month about what we need after all the expenses and revenues are in. He felt that next year would not be a high project year so that is why the expenses are projected to be lower. Bohling asked how often we receive our tax revenue, and Mahoney replied that it is paid monthly but September and May are the bigger months for tax collections.
