A. Natural Resources Conservation Service

Reichmuth provided a written report and reported on the programs keeping them busy. He announced that Bob Sullivan would be leaving NRCS on June 8.

B. Five Rivers RC&D

Sugden stated they are looking for ways to get FFA students from Johnson-Brock involved with RC&D. They have not heard if their DEQ grant for an electronics collection has been approved. However, their household hazardous waste grant was approved.

C. Nebraska Association of Resources Districts

Gigstad mentioned that their next meeting would be June 11 in conjunction with the basin tour, which would be in the Lower Platte South and Nemaha NRDs. Hilske explained the plans for the tour.

D. Nebraska Natural Resources Commission

A. Programs & Projects Committee

- 1. Well Permit Applications: None.
- 2. Discussion on Groundwater Rules Changes/Report on April 26th Committee Meeting: Gerweck explained that they are digging deeper into the rules and looking at how to address public well supplies. He encouraged everyone to look at the rules before they come to a vote in the next few months. They talked about adding a buffer zone where more points might be required for approval of a well. No action.

B. Operations & Education Committee
