D. Sugden reported that 46 people participated in the Doc Gigstad Run. He reported on the recent household hazardous waste collection. They are working on a pollinator grant for honey bees.

#### C. Nebraska Association of Resources Districts

Gigstad reported there was a good crowd for the Annual Conference. They raised \$23,300 for the Foundation. He reported on the growing number of requests for support of NETF grants and the need for a policy to address this.

## A. Programs & Projects Committee

- 1. Discussion on Changes to District's Groundwater Management Rules: Gerweck asked how much and how fast does the board wants to move on some of the things discussed back in March. It will take more time than they thought, and they need to gather more information. Hilske explained that we could continue with some of the housekeeping changes to the rules, but then we would have to wait the additional year required by law before making any other changes. The committee felt we should wait and do all the changes at one time so as not to delay additional changes because of the one-year waiting period. It was felt that by the time the studies are completed and we are ready to hold public meetings on the changes, it would be about a year from now. Consensus was to wait for all the data before making any changes to the rules.
