Sugden reported that there would be a grassland workshop in Cook on November 2. The recent household hazardous waste collections were smaller than normal.

C. Nebraska Association of Resources Districts

Gigstad reported on attendance as well as proceeds from the auction, trap shoot, golf tournament, and raffle at the Annual Conference in Kearney. They raised over \$21,000 for the NARD Foundation which funds several educational activities. They approved a new lobbying firm. They are also looking for volunteers for the 2020 National Envirothon to be held in Nebraska.

4. SWCP Applications Not Completed by Deadline: Nelson reviewed the circumstances that led up to these applications not meeting their deadline. The two applicants, Mitch Bauman and Derek Harms, were both in Otoe County and approved for the maximum cost-share of \$8,000 for storage terraces and tile. Deadline for all applicants approved for summer work was October 10, and tile had been installed but terrace construction had not begun on these two. Hilske added that our program is historically successful at getting all our funds spent because we are strict with deadlines.

Gerweck moved, seconded by Sugden, to extend the deadlines for the Mitch Bauman and the Derek Harms SWCP applications to November 8 but to assess a ten percent penalty on their final cost-share payment. More discussion centered on why these were being extended. After further discussion, motion carried.

B. Operations & Education Committee

1. Quotes for Installation of Picnic Shelters at Duck Creek Rec Area: Loseke reviewed the new information obtained including a local quote that staff obtained. Ouotes were as follows:

- 2. Changes to District's Park Fees Schedule: Loseke explained the discussions about possibly changing the park entry permit fees and/or RV camping fees. Beethe asked if the staff could estimate how much is spent on maintenance at the parks versus the fees we collect. Several ideas were discussed for increasing the park entry fees, and Loseke asked directors to forward their thoughts and ideas to the staff so they could form a recommendation for the board to consider next month. It was recommended that any changes be in place before January 1 when the new year's permits are sold. No action.
- 3. Revisions to District's Recreation Area Rules: Loseke reviewed some of the things that need to be added or changed as Duck Creek Rec Area is opened. Hilske explained that any changes would have to be presented at a public hearing prior to adoption. Hilske added that there are not a lot of things to change; however, if fees are updated, the wording in the rules could be changed so that future revisions would not necessarily require a public hearing. Stukenholtz asked the board to consider possibly allowing UTV's to use the interior roads and parking areas at the parks. There was some discussion on the pros and cons of this but no action taken.

- 1. Update on Buck Creek Road Box Culvert Elevation Change: Hilske reported that the County Engineer is trying to come up with some ideas to address this issue. We have notified them that we will not pay our share of the balance due until this issue is resolved.
