Water Resources Board Mailing Report May 8th, 2020 By Chuck Wingert, Water Resources Manager

1. No Well Permits Received this Month!

2. Water Sustainability Fund AEM Grant Update

- a. AGF (Aqua Geo Frameworks) received a bid from the Airborne Electromagnetic (AEM) vendor that was less than expected which has resulted in an additional 59 flight miles of data to be collected!
- b. AGF & the flight vendor are on schedule and plan to begin collecting flight data around the end of June.

3. Harmful Algae Bloom (HAB) Monitoring

- a. Due to the COVID-19 Directed Health Mandate, the Nebraska Department of Environment & Energy (NDEE, previously NDEQ), will not begin beach monitoring & laboratory testing for HAB until Monday May 18th, tentatively. Until then, we will continue our weekly lake monitoring & sampling, collecting physical water parameters (temperature, pH, conductivity & dissolved oxygen) and conducting bacteria analysis (total coliform & E.coli).
- b. Since 2004, the health alert concentration for microcystin (the toxin that is produced from the algae) has been 20 parts per billion (ppb) or greater for recreational waters beginning this year the health alert concentration has been reduced to 8 ppb so we may see our parks beaches closed more often than in the past.

4. Chemigation Inspections amid COVID-19

- a. I sent out a survey e-mail to all the NRD water staff throughout the State concerning their Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) amid COVID-19. All the responses I received were essentially the same, here are the results:
 - i. Maintain minimum 6-foot social distancing between NRD staff person & landowner/tenant.
 - ii. Carry a mask in case the landowner/tenant or NRD staff person does not feel comfortable with social distancing alone.
 - iii. NRD staff person and landowner/tenant not allowed to ride in same vehicle, on same four-wheeler or side by side.
 - iv. Wear latex gloves when handling any commonly touched equipment (check valve, vacuum relief valve, hose, etc.).
 - v. If the landowner/tenant or NRD staff person is feeling unwell, reschedule the inspection.

5. Voluntary Integrated Management Plan (VIMP)

- a. A kickoff Zoom meeting with Nebraska Department of Natural Resources (NDNR) staff, HDR Engineering, Bob and I was held on April 21st to discuss the process of the VIMP.
- b. The goal of an IMP is to manage hydrologically connected surface water and groundwater quantities to achieve and sustain a balance between water uses and water supplies for the long term.
- c. A stakeholder group consisting of groundwater and surface water irrigators, municipalities and industry users will be sought to identify goals & objectives for the plan and provide feedback.
- d. The next online meeting will be held May 12th, 2020.

6. 300 Point Minimum Well Permit Score Area of Richardson County

- a. Once again, due to the controversy of whether to reduce the minimum approval score for the well permit ranking system and not being able to have a public meeting, no action will be taken at this time.
- b. I have been continuing to review the geology of each registered well and CSD testhole within the 300-point minimum area hopefully we'll be able to hold a regular open meeting soon.
